Currently, the Christy's disappearance is not completely solved. It should be noted that, Agatha Christie's method of writing was a little strange. She finished the book to the last

chapter, and then chose the most unlikely of suspects and, returning to the beginning, reworked some moments to frame him. Agatha Christie's was not only fond in writing. She was one of the first British people to try surfing and had a lifelong interest in archaeology.

Like the great detective writer Agatha Christie, Charlie Chaplin also had many wonderful talents. Charlie Chaplin is probably the most well-known actor of the early 20th century. He is among those few people from the silent era whom we still recognize without much hassle. He took to the stage as the best opportunity for a career and made his professional debut at the age of eight as a member of a juvenile group called "The Eight Lancashire Lads".

Few people know that Audrey Hepburn was multilingual. She could speak five different languages. Audrey was fluent in Dutch, Spanish, English, Italian and French. An important point is that Audrey, being generous, had donated all the salaries she earned for her final movies to UNICEF. She had contributed to UNICEF since 1954.
